

Proactive approach, keeping in mind that we are not in the business of looking for issues.


- Admission forms
- Road to Health card
- Previous school and/or therapy reports
- Vision and Hearing screenings (included in fees)
 - iCommunicate (hearing)
 - NH Optometrists (vision)
- Motor screenings by an OT (included in fees)
- Baseline results (done by class teacher)



IDENTIFICATION

The "I" of SIAS at EPS

- Vulnerability identified via screening/s.
- Parents notified by teacher (verbal, email, vision/hearing report).
- In class support.
- Further support required SBST referral.
- School Based Support Team (SBST)
 - Panel members
 - Green consent form
 - Round table discussion with teacher and panel
 - SBST recommendations.





ASSESSMENT


The "A" of SIAS at EPS

- The SBST may recommend a full assessment at school (included in school fees).
- Administered by the Learning Support Specialists (Miss Horner, Mrs Bouwer or Mrs Gerber).
- Areas assessed (all perceptual and scholastic areas).
- Full report issued at parent teacher meeting.
- Individual Action / Support Plan developed.

SUPPORT

The last, **very important** "S" of SIAS at EPS

- Our aim is to offer Learning Support to all EPS learners who require perceptual, language, academic, emotional and/or social support at no extra cost to parents/guardians.
- Support is offered in class, in small groups and/or individually depending on the need of the learner.
- Extension and enrichment (for all Grade 1 3 classes. Gr 4-7 tbc as an extra mural).




